BOIL WATER ADVISORY ISSUED

THE HERITAGE HILLS WATER WORKS WATER SUPPLY BREAK & REPAIR

September 22, 2017

A boil water advisory has been issued by the Westchester County Department of Health and will remain in effect at least through Monday, September 25, 2017 and until further notice as a precautionary measure related to a water main break/repair, for residents and businesses of Heritage Hills in the town of Somers. The water main break occurred late Thursday night, September 21, 2017, and customers may have been experiencing low or no water pressure throughout the water system. The repair is expected to be completed late Friday night and normal water pressure will be restored.

THIS BOIL WATER ADVISORY AFFECTS ALL 3,600 RESIDENTS AND ALL BUSINESSES SERVED BY THE HERITAGE HILLS WATER WORKS WATER SUPPLY

A boil water advisory means that those in the affected area are strongly advised to boil all tap water at a rolling boil for a minimum of one minute prior to drinking it or using it to prepare food, wash dishes by hand or brush teeth. The advisory does not extend to bathing, washing clothes or using a dishwasher.

Restaurants, delis, bodegas, and all food service establishments in the affected area must boil water before serving it or using it to prepare food.

The boil water advisory was issued as a precaution to protect residents and business patrons from potential contamination caused by ground water infiltration into water mains as a result of the reduction in water main pressure caused by the break/repair.
