# What You need to know about Rabies!

Rabies is a deadly virus that lives in the saliva and brain tissue of infected animals.

Rabies is spread mainly through bites from infected animals. But, the virus can also be spread by scratches and contact with an infected animal's saliva.

Rabies is carried mainly by wild animals, such as: raccoons, skunks, bats and foxes. However, stray dogs and cats may also carry rabies.

Never touch wild or stray animals, always stay a safe distance from wildlife and pets you don't know.

Keep your pets safe, too. Have your dog, cat or ferret vaccinated (given a shot) against rabies by your veterinarian (animal doctor).

Even if your dog, cat or ferret always stays inside the house, he/she still needs to get vaccinated against rabies. **IT'S THE LAW.** 

Always walk your dog on a leash and keep your cats and ferrets inside. This will lower their chances of getting rabies from wild or stray animals.

Know the signs of rabies. An animal can look healthy even though it is infected with the rabies virus. However, if an animal acts strangely, such as: confused, running in circles, sluggish, foaming at the mouth or hyper, it may be rabid.

Always tell an adult about any contact you may have had with a wild or stray animal. Even baby animals can be sick with rabies, so never play with them.

If you find a bat on the ground or wake up to a bat tell an adult immediately. Do not touch it.

If you are bitten or scratched by any animal, tell an adult and report it to the Westchester County Department of Health. Wash the wound with warm, soapy water.

# Glossary

These are words that will help you learn about rabies:

Fatal: deadly

**Infected:** when a person or animal carries a sickness inside its body

**Rabid:** an animal that carries rabies is called a rabid animal

Stray: a pet that nobody owns, that lives outdoors and wanders around the neighborhood

Vaccinated: when people or pets are given shots to protect them from getting sick

Veterinarian: an animal doctor

Virus: a tiny germ that makes you or your pet sick

Wildlife: animals that are not pets, such as raccoons, skunks, foxes, or bats

# **Bat Rabies**

# Are Rabid Bats a Threat to Human Health?

Since 1980, more people in the United States have been infected with a bat rabies strain than any other strain. Bats infected with rabies may have the virus in their saliva and may transmit the disease to humans and other animals.

## Are all Bats Rabid?

Most bats are healthy and contribute to our environment in many ways. However, rabies has been confirmed in all nine indigenous species of New York bats. The vast majority of confirmed rabies cases occur in the big brown bats.

## How can Someone Tell if a Bat has Rabies?

Rabid bats may show abnormal behavior, such as outdoor activity during daylight; rabid bats may be grounded or paralyzed, or they bite a person or animal. Not all rabid bats act abnormally, but bats that do act abnormally are more likely to have rabies.

## Where do the Most Common Bats Roost?

The big brown bat and the little brown bat are common house bats that roost during spring and summer in attics, behind shutters, and in other sheltered areas of human dwellings and outbuildings. It is important to bat-proof your home before the bats arrive by blocking any small openings that will allow a bat entrance into your home.

# What if a Person is Bitten by a Bat?

A bat bite might be difficult or impossible to recognize. Rabies treatment should be considered for any physical contact with a bat, when a bite, scratch or contamination of any open wound or mucous membrane (eye, nose, mouth) cannot be ruled out. Sleeping in a room where bats were found, or gained entry, should also be considered an exposure that warrants reporting and, possibly, treatment. Wash any bite, scratch or other exposure site with warm soapy water. Then call your doctor or the Westchester County Health Department immediately if you suspect that you have been exposed to rabies. If possible, capture the bat and arrange for the Health Department to test the bat for rabies. \*Be extremely cautious when attempting to capture the bat, to minimize risk of further exposure.

# What if a Pet is Bitten by a Bat?

Whenever a dog, cat or other domestic animal with up-to-date rabies vaccination is bitten or comes into contact with a bat, capture the bat if possible. Immediately arrange with the local health department for the bat to be tested for rabies. If the bat is unavailable for testing, or tests positive for rabies, the pet must be given a rabies booster vaccination within five days. If an unvaccinated pet has contact with a rabid or suspect rabid bat, the pet must be euthanized or strictly confined for six months.




