


Project Director: Jiali Li, Ph.D. Director of Research & Evaluation In response to the growing public health crisis caused by opioid use, key indicators of the overall opioid burden must be reported both accurately and routinely. Such efforts can allow for comprehensive plans to be developed in order to address this ongoing epidemic, whether through prevention, education, treatment, or recovery.

Opioid overdose information for Westchester County is available through the New York State Department of Health (NYSDOH), which provides data on deaths, emergency department (ED) visits, and hospitalizations involving opioid overdose, as well as admissions to substance use disorder treatment programs. Data on deaths with detailed demographics are also available through the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC)'s National Center for Health Statistics. In this report, data from both sources are used to provide a closer look at the overall opioid burden in Westchester County.

Heroin Burden, Westchester County, 2023










Rate of deaths from heroin overdoses, Westchester County vs. NYS Excluding NYC, 2016 - 2023




Rate of deaths from overdoses involving opioid pain relievers, Westchester County vs. NYS Excluding NYC, 2016 - 2023










Rate of ED visits from heroin overdoses, Westchester County vs. NYS Excluding NYC, 2016 - 2023




Rate of ED visits from opioid overdoses excluding heroin, Westchester County vs. NYS Excluding NYC, 2016 - 2023






#### Rate of hospitalizations from all opioid overdoses, Westchester County vs. NYS Excluding NYC, 2016 - 2023



Rate of hospitalizations from heroin overdoses, Westchester County vs. NYS Excluding NYC, 2016 - 2023




Rate of hospitalizations from opioid overdoses excluding heroin, Westchester County vs. NYS Excluding NYC, 2016 - 2023
















Deaths involving opioid overdose by sex, Westchester County, 2016 - 2023




Rate of deaths involving opioid overdose by sex, Westchester County, 2016 - 2023



#### Deaths involving opioid overdose by age group, Westchester County, 2016 - 2023




Rate of deaths involving opioid overdose by age group, Westchester County, 2016 - 2023



#### Deaths involving opioid overdose by race, Westchester County, 2016 - 2023




Rate of deaths involving opioid overdose by race, Westchester County, 2016 - 2023



This Community Health Data Report was prepared using sources from the New York State Department of Health (NYSDOH) and the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC).

The NYSDOH publishes County Opioid Quarterly Reports that routinely report on the overall opioid burden in the state and in each county. This includes information pertaining to deaths, emergency department (ED) visits, and hospitalizations involving opioid use. Mortality data for New York State exclusive of New York City are from the NYSDOH Bureau of Vital Records. ED visit and hospitalization data are from the NYSDOH Statewide Planning and Research Cooperative System (SPARCS). The County Opioid Quarterly Reports also include admissions to substance use disorder treatment programs that are certified by the state's Office of Addiction Services and Supports (OASAS), as well as naloxone administration reports by the state's emergency medical services (EMS) agencies.

It is important to note that data from the County Opioid Quarterly Reports should not be considered as complete, as the confirmation of opioid overdose cases can cause delays in reporting. As a result, death, ED visit, and hospitalization numbers may change in subsequent quarterly reports due to additional confirmations and timing of the data received. Admissions to treatment programs may also change in subsequent quarterly reports due to delays in reporting by OASAS.

The CDC's National Center for Health Statistics (NCHS) maintains a database called the Wideranging Online Data for Epidemiological Research (WONDER). This database provides nationwide mortality data extracted from death certificates that are coded by each state and reported to the NCHS. Underlying and multiple causes of death via the tenth revision of the International Classification of Diseases (ICD-10) are available in this database. The ICD-10 code query for this report can be found in Appendix D. CDC WONDER also presents mortality data by various demographics, including sex, age group, race, and ethnicity, which the County Opioid Quarterly Reports do not provide.

Like the County Opioid Quarterly Reports, more recent data from CDC WONDER is considered provisional and therefore may change with routine updating of the database. As a result, mortality data from the NYSDOH and the CDC may differ in this report (see Appendices A and E).
