NO MEASLES EXPOSURE

Westchester County Health Department assures residents there is no measles exposure at this time.

(White Plains, NY) – Parents of fewer than a dozen children who attend a childcare center in northern Westchester were notified on Sunday that their children might have been exposed to measles, but definitive results tonight found that there was no exposure.

The alert came after a child who attends the daycare started to exhibit symptoms consistent with measles. The child, who was vaccinated, had been tested for measles but preliminary results were inconclusive.

Given the possible exposure, parents on Sunday had the choice of waiting for definitive results while keeping their children home from daycare or seeking post-exposure treatment at the Maria Ferrari Children's Hospital.

This choice was presented by the County Health Department in consultation with the New York State Department of Health. Parents of children potentially affected were contacted Sunday by County Health Department nurses.

The Health Department receives reports of suspected measles cases once a week. So far, no suspect cases have been confirmed to be measles.
